Allison Marie Loonto (MA, PhD, HDR) is a Research Professor of Sociology at the French National Institute for Research on Agriculture, Food and Environment (INRAE) and the Interdisciplinary Laboratory for Science, Innovation and Society (LISIS) at Gustave Eiffel University. Prof. Dr. Loonto is Vice President for Research for the International Sociological Association (ISA), an elected member of the Multi-stakeholder Advisory Committee of the Sustainable Food Systems Programme of the One Planet Network (UN Environment), an ex-Board Member of Commerce Equitable France (CEF), and a nominated of the French National Committee for Organic Agriculture (CNAB). Previously, she was a Science, Technology and Society Fellow at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, a Visiting Scientist at the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations and a Fulbright Fellow in Tanzania. Prof. Dr. Loonto is the author of 45 peer reviewed journal articles, 36 peer reviewed book chapters, 8 books (as author or editor) and 32 expert reports. She has edited 8 special issues of international peer reviewed journals and is the Chief Editor of the *International Journal of the Sociology of Agriculture and Food* (ISAF), an Associate Editor of the *Journal of Rural Studies*, and Associate Editor of *Science as Culture* and an editorial board member of *Agriculture and Human Values*. Prof. Dr. Loonto focuses on the governance of transitions to sustainable food systems, specifically on the metrics, models, standards and systems of certification that are part of emerging institutional innovations.
